Members of the public will not be permitted to speak during the meeting but may contact the Clerk (https://natchbeauchamp.pc@gmail.com) by noon on Tuesday 3 May to ask questions, raise concerns or make comments on matters affecting Hatch Beauchamp Parish. No decision can be taken during this session, but the Chair may decide to refer any matter for consideration.

1. Apologies

Members will be expected to provide reasons for absence. Members are reminded that absence for six consecutive meetings without approval could lead to disqualification.

2. Declarations of Interest

The Code of Conduct requires that Members disclose interests of a personal, prejudicial and pecuniary nature that may be pertinent to tonight's business. A prejudicial or pecuniary interest will require the member to leave the room during the discussion of the relevant item. In cases of uncertainty members are recommended to consult the Clerk.

3. To consider the following planning applications:

3.1 Case Ref: 19/22/0004 (Full Planning Permission)

Proposal: Erection of a part two storey and part single storey extension to the rear and erection of a first floor extension to the front of Rose Cottage, Village Road, Hatch Beauchamp

3.2 Case Ref: 19/22/0008 (Full Planning Permission) and 19/22/0009/LB (Listed Buildings Consent)

Proposal: Various internal alterations with installation of 1 No. rooflight and repair and alterations to outbuilding at Perris, Village Road, Hatch Beauchamp

3.3 Case Ref: 19/22/0007 (Full Planning Permission)

Proposal: Erection of 1 No. detached dwelling with detached garage/car port on land adjoining Palmers Green Cottage, Stewley Road, Hatch Beauchamp

Under the Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulations 2014, any members of the public are allowed to take photographs, film and audio record the proceedings and report on all public meetings (including on social media). You may not make an oral commentary during the meeting. The Chair has the power to control public recording and/or reporting so it does not disrupt the meeting. Recording must be clearly visible to anyone at the meeting. lease note that members of the public exercising their right to speak during Public Question Time may be recorded.
